The purpose of the Georgia Festival of Trees is to raise awareness and much-needed funds for organizations working to end the trafficking and commercial exploitation of women and children in Georgia.

Soluteer Basic Code of Conduct

As our ambassadors, we rely on your professionalism to spread the holiday cheer and ask that you keep the festivities flowing by following our Volunteer Code of Conduct.

- Our North Pole policy elves (ie the Festival Staff) want to remind you that having alcohol and illegal substances at the GWCC will land you on Santa's naughty list, so please leave them at home.
- In the spirit of spreading cheer to all, please keep the conversations merry and bright! Let's keep it family friendly with no inappropriate language.
- The World Congress Center is a Smoke Free Zone, so please don't smoke indoors.
- Keep the festive spirit alive by avoiding any scrooge-like behavior treating everyone with kindness and respect. If you witness any questionable behavior or shenanigans, don't hesitate to reach out to our Festival staff.
- While we understand that even Santa's helpers need a break, we kindly ask that you stay at your assigned post for the duration of your shift. If you need to dash away for a quick cocoa break, please arrange for coverage from another volunteer and check in with your shift supervisor.

Do Bring

Remember to bring all the important stuff for a holly-jolly time:

- Your mobile phone, the key to check-in, check out, and saving the day in case of emergencies. Just make sure it's on silent all through your shift.
- Don't forget your medication, if you need it during the day. Stay merry and bright with good health!
- Wear your comfiest business-casual clothes and sturdiest walking shoes, because we'll be dashing through the snow (or at least the event venue) all day long. Fashionably festive yet is the way to go! (More information about the dress code can be found on page 6).
- We've got concession carts and food kiosks galore, so please bring a credit/ debit card so you can indulge in a delicious snack whenever your tummy sings a holiday tune. (We are a cash-less venue.)

Do Not Bring

- Whether they're naughty or nice, please don't bring any VALUABLES OR WEAPONS!
- As there won't be any storage available, keep your personal items close. You can wear a jolly little belt bag or a cross body purse while you spread Christmas cheer as a volunteer.
- Just a reminder, this volunteer opportunity is for the big kids so no little elves under 11 years old are allowed.

General Information

Location: All shifts are located in Hall A-3 of the Georgia World Congress Center (285 Andrew Young International Blvd., NW, Atlanta, GA 30313). When you arrive, head straight to the Volunteer Check-In Area, where holiday cheer awaits you in front of Room 309. Signs will be posted along the halls.

Emergency Situations

- Know your surroundings: EXITS, first aid, escalators, stairwells, fire extinguishers

- Follow Instructions from Security • Personnel or Law Enforcement
- Help those around you to safety
- In the case of an evacuation, all Staff and Volunteers will exit the doors behind Reindeer games to the A Marshalling Lot.

Lost Child Procedures

If you find a lost child, 2 volunteers should escort them to the Guest Services office in Room 309. Guest Services staff will work to locate the child's parent.



Lost and Found Items

Report to Area Leaders, Security or Law Enforcement Describe specifically what you are reporting, including:

- What type of emergency, medical or fire
- Where it occurred, be as exact as possible
- Your location
- What actions have been taken

🖸 First Aid

If a life-threatening emergency or a police emergency arises and you cannot quickly reach an Area Leader with a radio, dial 911 on your cell phone and send another volunteer for help. All incidents should be reported to the Georgia Festival of Trees staff immediately.

For minor emergencies, please take the sick or injured person to the medical station located next to the entry doors near the bottom of the A3 Escalators. Look for the Amerimed Medical Services sign.

For major emergencies, please find the nearest Area Leader. Each leader has a radio to connect them to emergency personnel.

PARKING AT THE GEORGIA GEORGIA WORLD CONGRESS CENTER

The RED and GREEN Parking Decks are the most convenient to park your sleigh and then jingle over to Hall A-3. We have secured a special treat for all of our merry volunteers - a single \$5.00 parking pass for either the RED or GREEN parking decks each day you volunteer. Remember, it's a onetime deal, so park your sleigh once a day - no coming and going.

To receive the special, \$5 parking rate, you must have your ticket validated at the Volunteer Check-In table during check-in or check out.

When it comes to parking at the GWCC, even Santa doesn't have magical powers. We can definitely give you some suggestions, but **please be aware that Georgia Festival of Trees does not have any control over the parking lots.** Take a peek at the maps below to discover additional parking areas at the GWCC and the surrounding areas in case you are unable to park in the RED or GREEN parking decks.



On rainy days, you may want to park in the RED deck as access to Hall A-3 is completely covered.

From the GREEN deck, you will take a short walk outside to get into the GWCC and continue to Hall A-3.

Georgia World Congress Center

There will be food available for purchase inside the venue and in the areas surrounding the Georgia World Congress Center. If you wish to bring a sack lunch, there will be a designated area in the Festival office to leave it while you volunteer. Please note there is no microwave or refrigerator available. Although the Festival office is fully staffed, we cannot monitor food left by volunteers. Please mark your items clearly and take any leftovers with you at the end of your shift. Food items left behind will be disposed of at the end of each day.

Festival Venue Dining

The Festival will feature several food vendors within the venue. Food can be purchased and eaten, either during breaks, or before and after a volunteer shift.

Neighborhood Dining Options

There are many dining options located within walking distance or a short drive from the GWCC. We highly recommend utilizing Uber or Lyft if you choose to leave the GWCC area, avoiding additional parking fees. HOLIDAY MAGIC HAPPENS HERE



Uber and Lyft are great ways to get around the downtown area. This can be a convenient way to avoid the stress of driving in traffic and paying for parking (even at a discounted rate)!

How do Uber and Lyft work? Download the Uber or Lyft app on your phone using the Apple App Store or Google Play Stores. The apps are simple to use!

Be sure to allow plenty of time to catch your ride and arrive early for your shift!



The Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) is Atlanta's public transportation system comprised of a bus and rail system that connects all parts of Atlanta. A single \$2.50 fare covers one-way bus or train trips, including transfers. The GWCC is MARTA accessible at two stations.

For many events on the GWCC authority campus, parking is at a premium and MARTA is the fastest and easiest way to arrive. This is especially true for Mercedes-Benz Stadium events, where MARTA is highly recommended.

THE GWCC AUTHORITY IS MARTA ACCESSIBLE AT THREE STATIONS.

- Events in Centennial Olympic Park can use the GWCC/CNN Station (W-1) or the Peachtree Center Station (N-1) which is approximately a six block walk.
- Events in GWCC Buildings A and B can use the GWCC/CNN Station (W-1).
- Events in GWCC Building C can use the GWCC/CNN Station (W-1) or the Vine City Station (W-2).

FAQs

Our frequently asked questions are answered below.

HOW DO I REGISTER?

To register as a volunteer, go to gafestivaloftrees. org/volunteer and fill out the quick form. You will be immediately directed to our volunteer portal, Bloomerang, where you can view volunteer opportunities and register as a volunteer in our organization. This process takes about 5-8 minutes and is a crucial part of the process.

HOW MANY SHIFTS CAN I WORK?

There are no limits to the number of shifts a volunteer can work. We recommend that you sign up for shifts you are committed to covering so we are not short-staffed. We understand that sometimes life happens. If for some reason you cannot keep your commitment, we ask that you notify us by emailing volunteers@gafestivaloftrees.org.

HOW LODG IS A SHIFT?

Most shifts at the Georgia Festival of Trees are 4.5 hours long. On set-up days (Wednesday, November 16th and Thursday, November 17th) and teardown days (Sunday, November 26th and Monday, November 27th) shifts are 5 hours.

WHERE DO I PARK?

We suggest that volunteers park in the RED or GREEN parking decks. On rainy days, you may want to park in the RED deck as access to Hall A-3 is completely covered. From the GREEN deck, you will take a short walk outside to get into the GWCC and continue to Hall A-3.

HOW DO I SELECT MY SHIFTS?

Once you are registered in our Volunteer Portal, you can register for any shift that sounds appealing to you. If you get lost in the system, you can find available options by clicking the white Bloomerang icon in the upper left-hand corner of the page. Once you select an opportunity, you will be guided to choose a shift that works best for you.

WILL I RECEIVE TICKETS TO THE EVENT?

All volunteers will receive two complimentary general admission tickets valued at nearly \$40. These can be used or shared by the volunteer. Please be sure you are registered in our portal. We will be using our list of registered volunteers to determine the complimentary ticket count.

You will receive a special redemption code the week before the festival, allowing you to claim your tickets. We want to thank you for your generous service and provide you with an opportunity to enjoy the festival with your family and friends.



FAQs

Our frequently asked questions are answered below.

HOW MUCH IS PARKING?

We have negotiated a volunteer parking rate of \$5.00. You will need to have your parking ticket validated at the Volunteer Check-In table to receive the special, volunteer rate.

WHAT IS THE DRESS CODE FOR VOLUNTEERS?

We ask volunteers to wear dark-colored pants or skirt and red, green, or white shirts. You will receive a Georgia Festival of Trees apron and lanyard upon arrival, and you will need to wear both during your shift. The World Congress Center requires all volunteers always to wear a name tag. When you have finished volunteering, your apron and lanyard are yours to keep. (See also page 6 of this handbook.)

WILL THERE BE TRAINING FOR VOLUNTEERS?

Along with Volunteer Orientations offered in October/November, you will receive training documents from each department in which you have registered to volunteer. Your volunteer coordinator will provide this information when it is available.

Please be prepared to either bring your own lunch purchase food at the Georgia World Congress Center or in a restaurant nearby. We have provided a comprehensive list of dining options on page 14 of this handbook.

Volunteers can bring a lunch or snack and place it in a designated space in the Festival Main Office located in Room 309. There is no refrigerated storage or microwave available. Please mark your items well. All unclaimed food items and their containers will be discarded at the end of each day.
